1. BACKGROUND AND CONTEXT

The National Lotteries Commission (NLC), previously known as the National Lotteries Board (NLB), is a public entity established by Lotteries Amendment Act No. 32 of 2013 to regulate the South African Lotteries industry. The functions of the Commission can be divided into two categories, namely “regulation of National Lottery and other Lotteries” and “administration of the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund (NLDTF)”.

The Distributing Agencies (DA’s) who are appointed by the Minister of Trade & Industry are responsible for the adjudication of the funding applications as per the Lotteries Act and applicable Regulations.

In pursuit of its mission of distributing funding for good causes and contributing to the improvement of socio-economic conditions in poor communities across South Africa, the Commission largely supports various organizations involved in charities, sports and recreation, as well as those working in the arts, culture, national heritage and environment sectors. Sectors funded by the NLC contribute to job creation, rural development, infrastructure development, promoting wellness and social cohesion. This aligns to the objectives of the NDP to eliminate poverty, reduce inequality by 2030 and bring about economic growth (NLB Strategic Plan 2014-2019).

Given the amount of funding that has been distributed to a wide range of beneficiaries over the years, the Commission has realized the need to strengthen reporting, monitoring and evaluation mechanisms. Thus, the Monitoring and Evaluation unit was established in 2014. In order to demonstrate the impact of funding provided through the NLDTF, one of the key responsibilities of the unit is to coordinate and manage impact evaluation studies. Over and above, the Unit has over time collected and reported extensively on progress towards reaching impact using monitoring data submitted by beneficiaries on a quarterly basis.

Having been in the grant funding business for the over 17 years and has disbursed funds a lot of funds since inception, NLC is commissioning an external impact evaluation study on beneficiaries from all sectors. Each sector has a list of sub-sectors (see attached 'Annexure 1') wherein each beneficiary belongs as per their nature of work.

These non -profit organisations (NPOs) are geographically located in all nine provinces within the borders of South Africa. However, this proposed evaluation will specifically target only four small provinces, namely, Free State, Mpumalanga, Northern Cape and North West.

The NLC invites suitably qualified and experienced bidders to submit proposals. In line with the requirements of the Public Finance Management Act (PFMA) No. 1 of 1999 and Treasury Regulations, the NLC seeks to engage the services of a duly qualified bidder.

2. EVALUATION PURPOSE

The purpose the terms of reference (TOR) is to appoint a suitable service provider to conduct an Impact Evaluation Study.

3. OBJECTIVES

As part of the assessment of impact of funding to beneficiaries in targeted organizations, the evaluation should seek to focus on the following specific objectives:

- 3.1 To gather evidence on the impact of NLC funding in its mandate as catalyst for social upliftment.
- 3.2 What were the key enablers and barriers in implementing the project/programme.

3.3 To draw lessons from the results of the Evaluation to facilitate strategic learning and reflection by the NLC

4. SCOPE OF WORK

In their bidding, evaluators will be expected to demonstrate extensive experience in developing and applying a methodology that will take into cognizance NLC and most importantly targeted provinces' dynamics. This is in relation to the funding approach and model. Based on the above stated, the bidders therefore should propose relevant designs to respond to the evaluation questions. In their design, the evaluators should clearly state the methodological frameworks and approaches that will be utilized in the study. Having said that, innovative qualitative and quantitative data collection techniques should be employed.

As a guideline, the evaluators are advised to consider the following in their methodology:

a) Literature review:

- Review of the Acts and regulations as well as other relevant government policy documents;
- NLC Strategy and annual performance reports;
- Applications, progress reports, grant agreements and site visit reports; and
- Any other relevant documents.

b) Data collection:

- Interviews with members of current and previous members of the Distributing Agencies, NLC Board and management;
- Interviews with approximately 400 sampled primary beneficiaries;
- Interviews with the secondary and tertiary beneficiaries of the sampled primary beneficiaries;
- Site visits to the sampled primary, secondary and tertiary beneficiaries;

- Survey in communities of the sampled beneficiaries in all the four targeted provinces;
- Case Studies; and
- Any other method deemed relevant for the exercise.

c) Reporting

- Although a suggested report template has been annexed herein (see *Annexure 2*), evaluators will be expected to enhance it, ensuring that all critical elements are encapsulated.

As a limitation, evaluators should note that there is no baseline survey report available to assist with determining the effects of NLC funding. Therefore, in their bidding, evaluators will be expected to demonstrate innovative mechanisms to address this gap to efficiently and effectively execute this exercise.

5. DELIVERABLES

In terms of timing, the total duration of this proposed Evaluation should be 5 months. It is expected that the evaluator upon finalising their evaluation design will factor in all the deliverables and their deadlines to be reviewed and approved by the NLC Evaluation Team. The list of deliverables should be specific in terms of their timing, format, content, length, intended audience and the expected review process. In terms of language, all the deliverables are expected to be delivered in English. Having said that, it will be critical for the deliverables to be concise, analytical in nature rather than long descriptive texts.

At the minimum, the deliverables should include the following:

Over and above, the evaluator will be expected to communicate progress to the team on a weekly basis.

6. EVALUATION TEAM COMPOSITION

As part of their evaluation plan under the design, the Evaluator will be expected to establish an evaluation team including but not limited to the evaluation manager and data collectors. The team will be expected to execute all tasks from inception until completion of the exercise. It would be their responsibility to ensure that the team members have the necessary skills and competencies to execute their responsibilities. A discussion and decision on the size of the team will reside in the hands of both NLC and the evaluator in view of the magnitude of the exercise, their tasks and deliverables. Having said that, it should be noted that approval of the design and plan remains the role of NLC.

An NLC team led by the Senior Specialist: Monitoring and Evaluation will principally provide oversight on the exercise. As stated on in Section 8, comments and feedback will be shared on a weekly basis in order to ascertain alignment.

7. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

The service provider will report to the Business Development Department.

8. DURATION OF THE PROJECT

The expected duration of the evaluation project should be six (6) months after signing of a Service Level Agreement (SLA). The completion date for the provision of the service is Friday, 15th February 2019.

9. COMPULSORY BRIEFING SESSION

A compulsory information session will be held at the NLC Head Office (Hatfield, Pretoria). The prospective bidder must read the terms of reference in detail and bring a copy to the information session.

The above-mentioned time frames must be strictly adhered to. No latecomers will be allowed into the information session. Failure to attend the briefing session will disqualify bidders from submitting proposals.

10. EVALUATION CRITERIA

The NLC will evaluate all proposals in terms of the Preferential Procurement Regulation of 2001 and Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act. No. 5 of 2000 (PPPFA). A three (3) phase evaluation criteria will be considered in evaluating the proposals, being:

a. Phase 1: Pre - Qualification Criteria (Mandatory Requirements)

Bidders must submit all the mentioned below requirements. The following mandatory requirements must be met to qualify for this bid:

- In the event of the bidder being in a joint venture, joint venture agreement must be submitted (*where applicable*); and
- Company registration certificates (CK). In the event of the bidder being a consortium organization, relevant shareholding certificates must be submitted (*where applicable*).
- Attendance certificate of the compulsory information session.

The following are non-mandatory requirements and should be submitted:

- Original signed standard bidding documents (SBD Forms); and
- Central Supplier Database (CSD) Summarized Report. Please submit the current CSD Report.

b. Phase 2: Functional/Technical Evaluation

Only bidders that have met the pre-qualification criteria will be evaluated for functional evaluation. In this phase the evaluation will be based on the bidders' responses in respect of the bid proposal (evaluated on the minimum functional specifications). Prospective bidders who score a minimum of 70% points or more will be considered for the next phase 3 (Price and B-BBEE status level contributor).

11. GENERAL GUIDELINES

11.1 Submission Instruction

The bid should be ***hand delivered to the address specified below*** in ***six (6) sets each***. One original plus five (5) copies of the proposal (i.e. six (6) sets in total) should be clearly marked:

Please note that the Technical and Financial proposals should be submitted in two (2) separate sealed envelopes.

Bidders are requested to indicate on the cover of each document whether it is the original document or a copy.

Take note of the following:

- No costs have been prescribed for the Bidding Document;
- All proposals **must** be costed in South African Rand, inclusive of VAT;
- If the bid does not include all the information required, or is incomplete, this will mean non-compliance and therefore invalidate the bid;
- Any submission received after the deadline will not be considered; and
- The costing must remain valid and open for evaluation for a period of at least six (6) months from the time of submission.

11.2 Late bids

Bids received late shall not be considered. A bid will be considered late if it arrived one second after 11:00 am or any time thereafter. The tender (bid) box shall be locked at exactly 11:00 am and bids arriving late will not be considered under any circumstances.

Bidders are therefore strongly advised to ensure that bids are dispatched allowing enough time for any unforeseen events that may delay the delivery of the bid.

The official Telkom time (Dial 1026) will be used to verify the exact closing time.

11.3 Costs to be borne by bidders

All costs and expenses incurred by the bidders in any way associated with the development, preparation and submission of responses and providing any additional information required by the NLC, will be borne entirely and exclusively by the bidders.

11.4 No legal relationship

No binding legal relationship will exist between any of the bidders and the NLC until the execution of a signed contractual SLA. The TOR document will not form part of any such contract or arrangement.

11.5 Evaluation of offers

Each bidder acknowledges and accepts that the NLC may, at its absolute discretion, apply selection criteria specified in this document for the evaluation of proposals for short listing/ selecting the eligible bidder(s).

11.6 Format of your proposal

The proposal should be presented in two sections i.e. Technical Proposal and Financial Proposal.

Technical Proposal Format

Bidders should submit technical proposal according to specifications provided in the TOR which must reflect the exact requirements and quantity required in paragraph 4.

Technical Approach

The bidder should demonstrate adherence to the TOR by elaborating on the services required, and demonstrating whether the proposed proposal meets the requirements.

12. STANDARD REQUIREMENT OF THE BID

12.1 Disclosures

The bidder must disclose:

- a) If they are or have been the subject of any proceedings or other arrangements relating to bankruptcy/ insolvency.
- b) If they have been convicted of, or are the subject of any proceedings, relating to:
 - A criminal offence or other offence, involving the activities of a criminal nature in its organisation or found by any regulator or professional body to have committed professional misconduct;
 - Corruption, including the offer or receipt of any inducement of any kind in relation to obtaining any contract with any contracting authority; and
 - Failure to fulfil any obligation in any jurisdiction relating to the payment of taxes and other legal obligations.
- c) If a bidder or related company or any individual discloses details of any previous misconduct or complaint, the NLC will seek an explanation and background details from them. At the sole discretion of the NLC, an assessment as to whether the

bidder will be allowed to continue to the next phase of the evaluation phase will then be made.

- d) Disclosure extends to any company in the same group of the bidder, including but not limited to parent, subsidiary and sister companies, companies with common shareholders (whether direct or indirect) and parties with whom the bidder is associated in respect of this tender.

12.2 Disclaimer

- 11.1.1 The NLC reserves the right not to appoint a service provider.
- 11.1.2 The NLC may appoint more than one service provider.
- 11.1.3 The NLC also reserves the right to:
- a) Award the contract or any part thereof to one or more service providers;
 - b) Reject all bids;
 - c) Decline to consider any bids that do not conform to any aspect of the bidding requirements;
 - d) Request further information from any bidder after the closing date for clarity purposes;
 - e) Cancel this tender or any part thereof at any time; and
 - f) Should any of the above occur, it will be communicated in writing to the bidders.

12.3 Confidentiality

- a) Bids submitted will not be revealed to any other bidders and will be treated as contractually binding;

- b) All information pertaining to the NLC obtained by the bidder as a result of participation in this RFP is confidential and must not be disclosed without written authorisation from the NLC; and
- c) The successful bidder will be expected to sign a SLA with the NLC.

12.4 Disqualification

- a) Any form of canvassing/lobbying/influence regarding the short listing will result in disqualification;
- b) Any non-disclosure of any other information pertaining to this bid will result in disqualification;
- c) Non-compliance with the bid requirements will invalidate the bid; and
- d) Non-compliance with all the applicable Acts, Regulations and by-laws will result in the disqualification of the bid.

12.5 Prices

- a) All services' pricing should be inclusive of all taxes etc. and payment shall be made in South African Rand;
- b) The NLC may require a breakdown of prices on any of the items priced and the bidders are to provide same without any additional cost and also provide a "Pricing Grid" or "Transaction Fee Schedule";
- b) Service provider to provide total bid price according to the pricing schedule. Refer to "*Annexure 3*"; and
- c) The total amount should be carried out on the Standard Bidding Document (SBD1) Form.

12.6 Prices adjustments

No price adjustment for this research service.

12.7 Payment terms

- a) The NLC undertakes to pay valid tax invoices in full within thirty (30) days from statement date for services rendered;
- b) All supporting documents for services rendered should be submitted together with the tax invoices by the twentieth (20th) of every month;

12.8 Validity

- a) A proposal shall remain valid for ninety (90) days after the closing date of the submission for proposals. A proposal which is valid for a shorter period may be rejected by the NLC for non-responsiveness.
- b) In exceptional circumstances, the NLC may solicit the bidder's consent to an extension of the period of the validity of the bid. The request and responses thereto shall be made in writing. A bidder that has been granted the request will neither be required nor permitted to modify the proposal.

12.9 Signatories

All responses to this RFP should be signed off by the authorised signatories of the bidder.

13. SPECIAL TERMS AND CONDITIONS

CERTIFICATE OF INDEPENDENT BID DETERMINATION

- 1 This Standard Bidding Document (SBD) must form part of all bids¹ invited.
- 2 Section 4 (1) (b) (iii) of the Competition Act No. 89 of 1998, as amended, prohibits an agreement between, or concerted practice by, firms, or a decision by an association of firms, if it is between parties in a horizontal relationship and if it involves collusive bidding (or bid rigging).² Collusive bidding is a *pe se* prohibition meaning that it cannot be justified under any grounds.
- 3 Treasury Regulation 16A9 prescribes that accounting officers and accounting authorities must take all reasonable steps to prevent abuse of the supply chain management system and authorizes accounting officers and accounting authorities to:
 - a. disregard the bid of any bidder if that bidder, or any of its directors have abused the institution's supply chain management system and or committed fraud or any other improper conduct in relation to such system.
