2021 / 2022 CALL FOR APPLICATIONS

The Sport and Recreation Distributing Agency (SRDA) established in terms of the Lotteries Act, 1997 (No. 57 of 1997, as amended) is once again able to consider applications for funding from the proceeds of the National Lottery.

The SRDA will focus on the below funding areas, aligned to Government's commitment to the development of "an active and winning nation" that equitably improves the lives of all South Africans and recognising the power of sport as an integral part of social cohesion and nation building.

In adjudicating applications, the SRDA will give preference to applications from organisations in underdeveloped areas that advance the interests and participation of the youth, women, and people with disabilities as well as projects that focus on job creation and retention.

Applications for funding will be considered from registered sporting non-profit organisations or affiliated sports organisations that submit all the required documents and information as outlined in the **Guidelines**.

NB The NLC encourages organisations to ensure that project/programme activities applied for are in line with COVID-19 alert level restrictions in terms of the Disaster Management Act and Regulations.
