NLC Addresses Delays in Application Adjudications Due to Limited Distributing Agency Members

[Tshwane, 25 June 2024] The National Lotteries Commission (NLC) is dedicated to maintaining the highest standards of transparency and accountability in its grant funding operations.

Distributing Agency Members play a crucial role in ensuring that funds raised through the National Lottery are allocated fairly and transparently to qualifying causes and organisations. However, due to current staffing challenges, the pace of adjudication has been adversely affected, causing inconvenience and uncertainty for many applicants.

The current limited number of Distributing Agency Members within the NLC has led to significant delays in processing and adjudicating applications. This shortage has strained the Commission's ability to function efficiently, resulting in prolonged waiting times for applicants.

The NLC understands the frustration and sincerely apologises for the challenges these delays cause, particularly for organisations relying on these funds to support vital projects and initiatives. Please be assured that the NLC is highly aware of the situation and is actively working with the Department of Trade, Industry and Competition to address the issue.

As we navigate these challenging times, your patience and understanding are greatly appreciated. The NLC remains committed to its mission of promoting public benefit through the distribution of lottery funds. We are dedicated to ensuring that all deserving applications are reviewed and adjudicated in a timely and fair manner.
