SECTION 1: INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND AND SCOPE OF REQUIREMENTS

1. INTRODUCTION AND BACKGROUND

The National Lotteries Commission (The NLC) is a public entity established by Lotteries Act No. 57 of 1997, as amended to regulate the South African lotteries industry. The functions of the NLC can be divided into two categories, namely “regulation of National Lottery and other Lotteries” and “administration of the National Lottery Distribution Trust Fund (NLDTF)”.

2. PURPOSE

The NLC invites qualified and experienced service providers to submit quotations for the once-off supply and delivery of tools and equipment required to support the operational and maintenance requirements of the Commission.

3. SCOPE OF REQUIREMENT

The appointed service provider shall be responsible for the following:

- Supply and deliver all tools and equipment as specified in the RFQ and the attached pricing schedule.
- Ensure that all items supplied are new, unused, of high quality, and free from defects.
- Supply products that comply with applicable South African National Standards (SANS) or equivalent industry standards, where applicable.
- Deliver the tools and equipment to the National Lotteries Commission's designated delivery address within the agreed delivery period.
- Ensure that all items are adequately packaged to prevent damage during transportation and handling.
- Offload and place the delivered items at the designated receiving area as directed by the NLC representative.
- Replace, at no additional cost to the NLC, any defective, damaged, incorrect, or non-compliant items identified upon delivery or during the warranty period.
- Provide manufacturer's warranties, operating manuals, and relevant certificates of conformity (where applicable) for all equipment supplied.

- Ensure that all supplied equipment includes all standard accessories, components, and attachments necessary for its intended operation.

4. QUALITY ASSURANCE

The NLC reserves the right to inspect all delivered goods to verify compliance with the specified requirements. Any goods that do not conform to the required specifications or quality standards may be rejected and must be replaced by the supplier at no additional cost to the NLC.

5. WARRANTY

The supplier shall provide a minimum manufacturer's warranty on all applicable tools and equipment. During the warranty period, any defective items shall be repaired or replaced at no additional cost by the National Lotteries Commission.

6. DELIVERABLES

The successful service provider shall provide:

- Complete supply of all specified tools and equipment.
- Delivery note indicating all items supplied.
- Warranty documentation.
- User manuals (where applicable).
- Tax invoice upon successful delivery.
- Any applicable certificates of compliance or authenticity.

7. SPECIFICATIONS

The National Lotteries Commission (NLC) requires the successful bidder to supply and deliver tools and equipment that meet the minimum specifications outlined below.

8. REPORTING

The appointed Service Provider shall report directly to the NLC **Facilities Management Unit (FMU)**,

9. DURATION OF THE PROJECT

This appointment is for a **once-off** supply and delivery of the specified tools and equipment. The contract shall commence upon the issuance of an official Purchase Order and shall be deemed complete upon the successful delivery, inspection, and acceptance of all goods by the NLC.

SECTION 2: NOTICE TO BIDDERS

1. Terms and conditions of Request for Quotation (RFQ)

- 1.1 This document may contain confidential information that is the property of the Commission.
- 1.2 No part of the contents may be used, copied, disclosed, or conveyed in whole or in part

to any party in any manner whatsoever other than for preparing a proposal in response to this RFQ without prior written permission from the Commission.

- 1.3 All copyright and intellectual property herein vests with the Commission.
- 1.4 Late and incomplete submissions will not be accepted.
- 1.5 No services must be rendered, or goods delivered before an official Commission Purchase Order form has been received.
- 1.6 This RFQ will be evaluated in terms of the 80/20 preference point system prescribed by the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act of 2000 and PPR of 2022.
- 1.7 Suppliers are required to register on the Central Supplier Database at www.csd.gov.za.
- 1.8 Suppliers must provide their CSD registration number (and attach a CSD Summary report) and ensure that their tax matters are compliant.
- 1.9 All questions regarding this RFQ must be forwarded to maureen@nlcsa.org.za, within three (3) days of the closing date.
- 1.10 Any supplier who has reasons to believe that the RFQ specification is based on a specific brand must inform the Commission via the email.

2. General rules and instructions

- 2.1 News and press releases
 - 2.1.1 Bidders or their agents shall not make any news releases concerning this RFP or the awarding of the same or any resulting agreement(s) without the consent of, and then only in co-ordination with, the Commission.
- 2.2 Precedence of documents
 - 2.2.1 This RFP consists of several sections. Where there is a contradiction in terms between the clauses, phrases, words, stipulations, or terms and herein referred to generally as stipulations in this RFP and the stipulations in any other document attached hereto, or the RFP submitted hereto, the relevant stipulations in this RFP shall take precedence.
 - 2.2.2 Where this RFP is silent on any matter, the relevant stipulations addressing such matter, and which appear in the PPPFA shall take precedence. Bidders shall refrain from incorporating any additional stipulations in its proposal submitted in terms hereof other than in the form of a clearly marked recommendation that the Commission may in its sole discretion elect to import or to ignore. Any such inclusion shall not be used for any purpose of interpretation unless it has been so imported or acknowledged by the

Commission.

2.2.3 It is acknowledged that all stipulations in the PPPFA are not equally applicable to all matters addressed in this RFP. It, however, remains the exclusive domain and election of the Commission as to which of these stipulations are applicable and to what extent. Bidders are hereby acknowledging that the decision of the commission in this regard is final and binding. The onus to enquire and obtain clarity in this regard rests with the Bidder(s). The Bidder(s) shall take care to restrict its enquiries in this regard to the most reasonable interpretations required to ensure the necessary consensus.

2.3 Preferential procurement reform

2.3.1 The commission supports B-BBEE as an essential ingredient of its business. In accordance with government policy, the commission insists that the private sector demonstrates its commitment and track record to B- BBEE in the areas of ownership (shareholding), skills transfer, employment equity and procurement practices (SMME Development) etc.

2.4 National Industrial Participation Programme.

2.4.1 The Industrial Participation policy, which was endorsed by Cabinet on 30 April 1997, is applicable to contracts that have an imported content. The NIP is obligatory and therefore must be complied with. Bidders are required to sign and submit the Standard Bidding Document (SBD).

2.5 Language

2.5.1 Bids shall be submitted in English.

2.6 Gender

2.6.1 Any word implying any gender shall be interpreted to imply all other genders.

2.7 Headings

2.7.1 Headings are incorporated into this RFQ document and submitted in response thereto, for ease of reference only and shall not form part thereof for any purpose of interpretation or for any other purpose.

2.8 Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993

2.8.1 The Bidder warrants that all its employees (including the employees of any sub-contractor that may be appointed) are covered in terms of the Compensation for

Occupational Injuries and Diseases Act 13 of 1993 and that the cover shall remain in force for the duration of the adjudication of this RFQ and/ or subsequent agreement. the commission reserves the right to request the Bidder to submit documentary proof of the Bidder's registration and "good standing" with the Compensation Fund, or similar proof acceptable to the commission.

2.9 Processing of the Bidder's Personal Information

2.9.1 All Personal Information of the Bidder, its employees, representatives, associates and sub-contractors ("Bidder Personal Information") required under this RFP is collected and processed for the purpose of assessing the content of its tender proposal and awarding the bid. The assessment and award of the bid shall be conducted in accordance with applicable legislation including the PPPFA and NLC SCM Policy.

The Bidder is advised that Bidder Personal Information may be passed on to third parties to whom the commission is compelled by law to provide such information. For example, where appropriate, the commission is compelled to submit information to National Treasury's Database of Restricted Suppliers.

2.9.2 All Personal Information collected will be processed in accordance with POPIA and with the commission Data Privacy Policy.

2.9.3 The commission will ensure that the rights of the Bidder and of its employees and representatives (i.e., the right of access and the right to rectify) are effectively guaranteed in accordance with the procedures as specified in the commission PAIA manual.

2.9.4 In signing this document, the Bidder consents to the use of its Personal Information for the purposes as specified in section 2.9.1 above.

3. National Treasury's Central Supplier Database

3.1 Bidders are required to self-register on National Treasury's Central Supplier Database (CSD) which has been established to centrally administer supplier information for all organs of state and facilitate the verification of certain key supplier information.

3.2 The Commission may not award business to a bidder who has failed to register on the CSD.

3.3 Only foreign suppliers with no local registered entity need not register on the CSD.

4. Confidentiality

- 4.1 Bids submitted for this Request for Proposals will not be revealed to any other bidders and will be treated as contractually binding.
- 4.2 The Commission reserves all the rights afforded to it by the POPIA in the processing of any of its information as contained in Bid Proposals.
- 4.3 The Bidder acknowledges that it will obtain and have access to personal information of The Commission and agrees that it shall only process the information disclosed by the Commission in terms of this bid award and only for the purposes as detailed in this RFQ and in accordance with any applicable law.
- 4.4 The Bidder shall notify the Commission in writing of any unauthorized access to personal information and the information of a third party, through cybercrimes or suspected cybercrimes, in its knowledge and reports such crimes or suspected crimes to the relevant authorities in accordance with applicable laws, after becoming aware of such.

5. Communication

- 5.1 Specific queries relating to this RFQ should be submitted maureen@nlcsa.org.za, before the closing date.
- 5.2 In the interest of fairness and transparency the Commission's response to such a query may be made available to other bidders.
- 5.3 It is prohibited for bidders to attempt, either directly or indirectly, to canvass any officer or employee of the Commission in respect of this RFQ between the closing date and the date of the award of the business.
- 5.4 Bidders found to be in collusion with one another will be automatically disqualified and restricted from doing business with organs of state for a specified period.

6. Supplier Performance

- 6.1 The National Lotteries Commission conducts regular performance reviews in accordance with the requirements for the classification of the contract and or stakeholder by making use of supplier evaluation forms. The evaluation is conducted against the deliverables or scope of the contract with a minimum of an annual review.

- 6.2 Ad-hoc performance reviews shall be conducted where non-performance is identified outside the review period.
- 6.3 Non-performance will be addressed with at least a formal letter advising specific non-performing areas and stating remedial action/s required within specific time frames. Non-adherence to remedial actions shall lead to escalating performance management actions.
- 6.4 Any party to this agreement may request to participate in a joint performance review where appropriate and seek continuous improvement opportunities.
